





# Onomichi Historical Museum



Alighting at Onomichi station, a glance over your shoulder reveals a small mountain. This is Mt. Senkoji, just 144.2 meters above sea level. Senkoji Park, which stretches halfway up the mountain to the summit, features cherry blossoms and azaleas blooming in spring, followed by pink and purple Japanese wisteria flowers in early summer.

There is also a walkway known as the Path of Literature, where you can gaze around the stone monuments with poetry and feel the heart of literary figures who loved Onomichi. The mountain top observatory boasts views of the city of Onomichi as well as the islands of the Shimanami Kaido and weather permitting, you may also be able to see a mountain range in Shikoku in the distance.

## Historical Temple Walk

In Onomichi, which escaped the war damage unscathed, many elderly temples remain. Twenty-five downtown temples in particular are connected via a flagstone path, familiarly known as a historical temple walk. The route runs east to west for around three kilometers, connecting unique temples, including Jikoji Temple, known for its stone gate and "Nigiri-botoke" where visitors can try making fist Buddhist images from clay, Tenneiji Temple, boasting five-hundred Buddha's disciple statues, Saikokuji Temple, famous for its Deva Gate with big Japanese sandals and Jodoji Temple, the so-called treasure house of Cultural Properties. Viewing the landscape of Onomichi Channel, which comes into view along the way, is a heartwarming experience.

## Onomichi 7-Temple Tour

Ever since Heian times, Onomichi has had divine protection. The historic seven temples; namely Jikoji, Tenneiji, Senkoji, Taisanji, Saikokuji, Jodoji and Kairyuji are located downtown and symbolize a religious faith which is still conveyed to people today. The connection between people transcending creed has made the Onomichi 7-Temple Tour a symbol of the healing town of Onomichi. Those who receive a red seal from each temple can obtain another seal that marks the "Manganjojiyu", meaning fulfillment of the wish prayed for to Buddhist deities at the final temple on the goshuincho (a notebook used to collect temple seals) and they will receive a paper wall hanging as a gift.





# Innoshima Ikuchijima

## Innoshima Suigun Castle

This is Japan's only Suigun (pirate-style) castle museum and houses a lot of armor and weaponry related to Murakami Suigun, who was active across the Seto Inland Sea based in Innoshima during the Northern and Southern Courts period in the Muromachi and Sengoku eras, to help bring bygone days to mind.

## Statues of Five Hundred Buddha's Disciples on Mt. Shirataki

Around 700 stone Buddhist images made by Kashihara Denroku and his disciples in 1827 are crammed here. The magnificent summit view inspired one of Japan's famous poets, Isamu Yoshi, to write; "Climbing up to the top of the Shirataki mountain will bring you a panoramic view with islands and ocean".

The landscape of Mt. Shirataki and its pyrethrum was selected as one of "the Best 100 scenic mountain villages in Japan".

## Oyamazumi Shrine

This shrine is also known as the head tutelary shrine of Japan, which has over 10,000 branch shrines nationwide and a focal point of people's worship from ancient times. The center of the shrine grounds houses a giant and sacred camphor tree, around 2,600 years old, while the treasure house features abundant armor, helmets and swords as designated national treasures and other important cultural properties stored and displayed. In April 2010, the main gate drawn on the old shrine map was rebuilt for the first time in around 700 years.


# Kosanji Temple Museum

Kosanji Temple on Mt. Chosei is a Buddhist temple of the Jodo Shinshu sect, Honganji division, founded by Koso Kosanji who became a Buddhist monk to pray for the repose of his mother's soul when she died. It took more than thirty years to complete the temple construction, introducing many of the various structures, which are modeled on some of Japan's finest architectural monuments; representative of eras from the Asuka through to the Edo. The temple is famous for its cherry blossoms and autumn leaves and the inside of the temple grounds colored with seasonal flowers and trees, akin to heaven on Earth.





There are three Japan Heritage sites in Shimanami area. Stories to convey Japanese culture and tradition through the local historical charm and stand-out features of Shimanami have been certified as Japan Heritage by the Agency for Cultural Affairs.



## Miniature garden-like city flourished since medieval times created thanks to the blessings of the Onomichi Channel

Onomichi, surrounded by a trio of mountains and islands on the opposite shore, has prospered as Setouchi's largest and best port ever since opening in medieval times; blessed by the Onomichi Channel, also known as "the river of the ocean", bisecting the city and attracting people, goods and financial fortune here. This also fueled a construction boom of temples, gardens and residential houses within the limited living space between the three Onomichi mountains and the Onomichi Channel, whereupon a miniature garden-like city came into being, bringing with it a taste of the medieval era into modern times, alongside with intricate alleys and slopes. The alley, as if entering the maze and the scenery featuring a broad panorama right in front of you after traversing the slope reveals a range of views, despite the limited space and still attracts people's interest now as in days of yore. ## The home ground of Japan's largest pirates: Geiyo Islands

– Evoking the memory of “Murakami Kaizoku” –

During the era of provincial wars, even missionary Luis Fróis described Murakami Kaizoku as Japan's largest pirate group. As opposed to “kaizoku” (pirates), who attack ships and grab money and goods without rhyme or reason, Murakami Kaizoku made a living to support efforts to maintain order in trade and distribution within the Seto Inland Sea, making marine life safer in accordance with the rules. The cultural properties comprising Japan Heritage include Mt. Shirataki, a beauty spot in Onomichi city and the ruins of Noshima Castle, an officially designated historical site, etc. A visit to the Geiyo Islands connecting Onomichi and Imabari will take you back to the way of life of Murakami Kaizoku, who ruled the sailing route in medieval times, which is now known as the Seto Inland Sea. ## The Shikoku Pilgrimage

– Migrational pilgrimage route and its unique pilgrimage culture –

The Shikoku Pilgrimage is a migrational pilgrimage grand route to visit temples associated with the Buddhist monk Kukai, one of the largest of its kind in Japan and stretching the entire length of 1400 kilometers, covering the entire circumference of Shikoku. Activities involving visits to official temples as part of the pilgrimage have remained ongoing for more than 1200 years and remain popular with people right up to the present day. The scenery at sites where Ohenrosan (pilgrims) come and go, such as steep mountain paths, long stone stairways, tranquil countryside, smooth seaside and distant capes has become part of the charm of the Shikoku route. Imabari city features six temples; namely, Enmeiji, Nankobo, Taisanji, Eifukuji, Senyuji and Kokubunji Temples. (Four prefectures of Shikoku: Ehime, Kochi, Tokushima and Kagawa, as well as 57 municipalities within each prefecture)

## Shimanami Kaido Cycling

“Setouchi Shimanami Kaido”, connecting the islands of the Seto Inland Sea between Onomichi City in Hiroshima Pref. and Imabari City in Ehime Pref. across nine bridges, is famed as a “Cyclists’ Sanctuary” and attracts many domestic and overseas bicycle enthusiasts alike. In 2014, the Shimanami Kaido concluded a Sister Cycling Road Agreement with “Sun Moon Lake Cycling Course” in Taiwan. A monument to the Cyclists’ Sanctuary is located in the Michi-no-Eki Tatara Shimanami Park (Omishima, Imabari City)

Furthermore the cycle tourism centered on the cyclists’ sanctuary “Setouchi Shimanami Kaido” received the Grand Prize of the 2016 “Sports Culture Tourism Award” from the Japan Sports Agency in cooperation with the Agency for Cultural Affairs and the Japan Tourism Agency.

This route was designated as the “First National Cycle Route” in 2019.
